



PETS ON PARK TRAILS

- Pets must be kept on a leash and under the physical control of the handler at all times.
- The leash may not exceed six feet in length.
- The handler is responsible for removal of all animal waste from park property, including hiking trails.
- Pets are not allowed outside of vehicles at Shore Acres State Park.
- If you are parked outside of Shore Acres State Park and you are hiking the trails, you may continue on the trail through the park but you may not enter the Shore Acres Gardens with your pet.





Situated in one of the most scenic areas on the Oregon coast, Sunset Bay State Park features beautiful sandy beaches protected by towering sea cliffs. Only a short walk from the beach, the campground has sites for tent camping and RV's, as well as cozy yurts. Day-use and picnic facilities are located along the bay to allow easy access for



The Oregon Coast Trail connects Sunset Bay with Shore Acres and Cape Arago State Parks. Hiking these trails offers a chance to experience pristine coastal forests and spectacular ocean vistas from atop the rugged cliffs and headlands.





Shore Acres State Park, the Oregon Coast's crown jewel, was once the private estate of lumber baron, Louis Simpson, founder of the community of North Bend. Perched on rugged sandstone cliffs high above the ocean, the park is an unexpected combination of beautiful natural and constructed features.




Hike down to a secluded ocean cove at Simpson

Beach. Skirt the cliff's edge for spectacular ocean vistas, which can include towering waves crashing against the shoreline after a storm and migrating grey whales. Where Simpson's mansion once stood, a fully enclosed observation building now offers ocean views and shelter from the elements.



Cape Arago State Park is a scenic headland jutting into the Pacific Ocean. Long used by native Americans, this third State Park offers amazing views of migrating whales and other marine mammals, as well as fishing boats and ships entering and leaving nearby Coos Bay.



intertidal plants and animals. The north cove trail provides access for fishing, beachcombing, and viewing the offshore colonies of seals and sea lions at Shell Island - a designated National Wildlife Refuge. This trail is closed March 1- June 30 to protect seal pups.
